There are **2,677** children waiting.

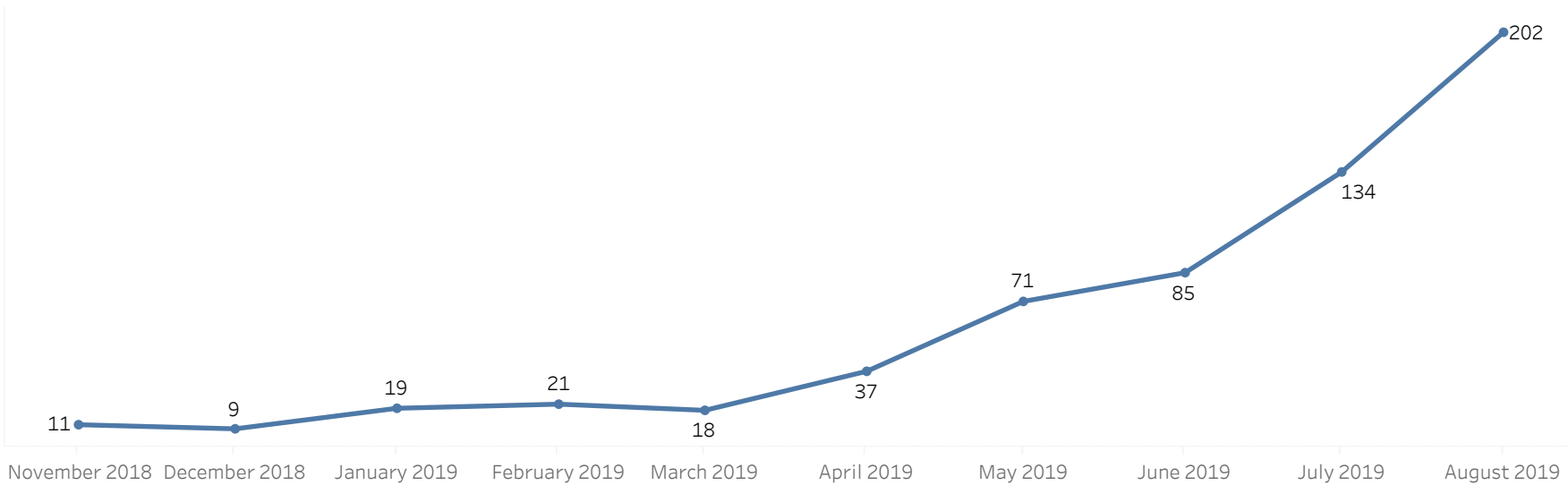
Of these, **231** submitted their applications just this month.

Of these, **477** were created just this month.

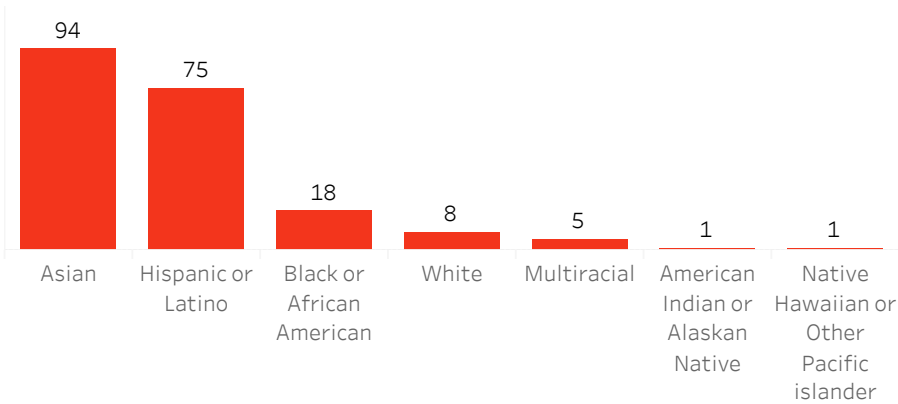

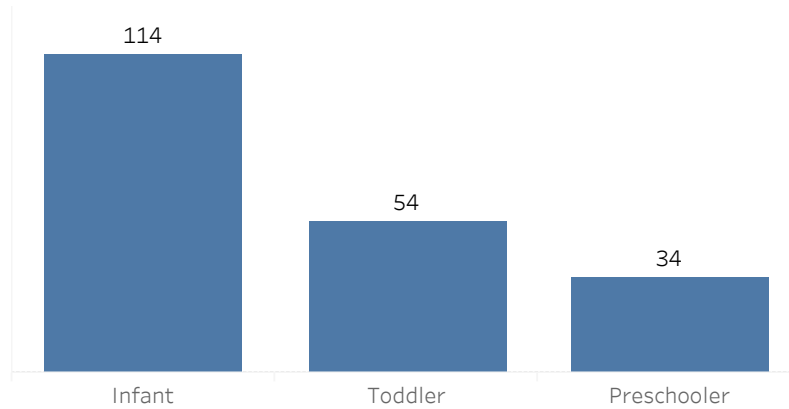

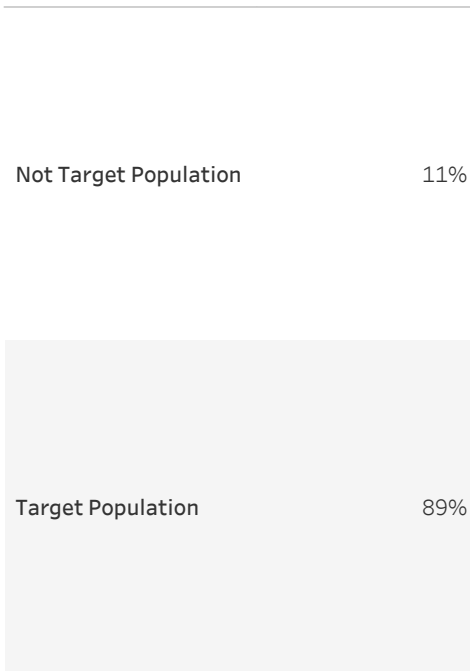
Race/Ethnicity



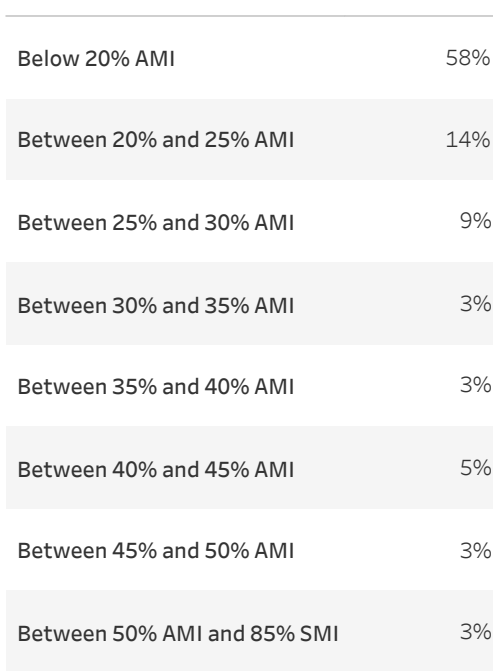

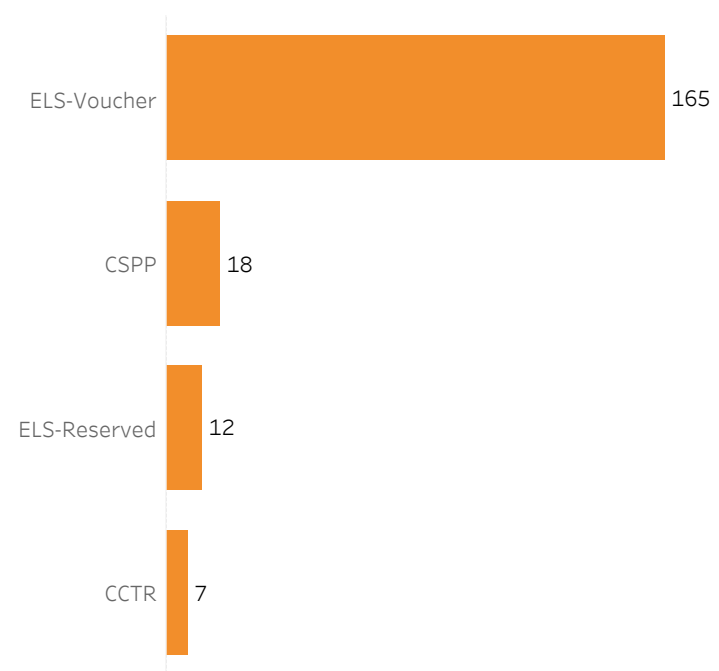

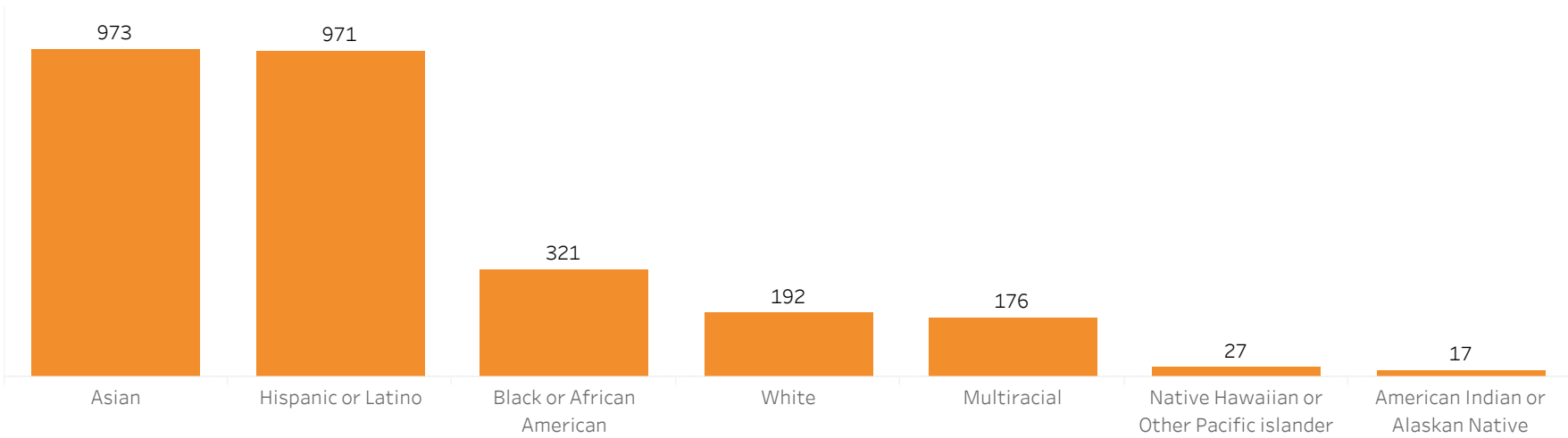

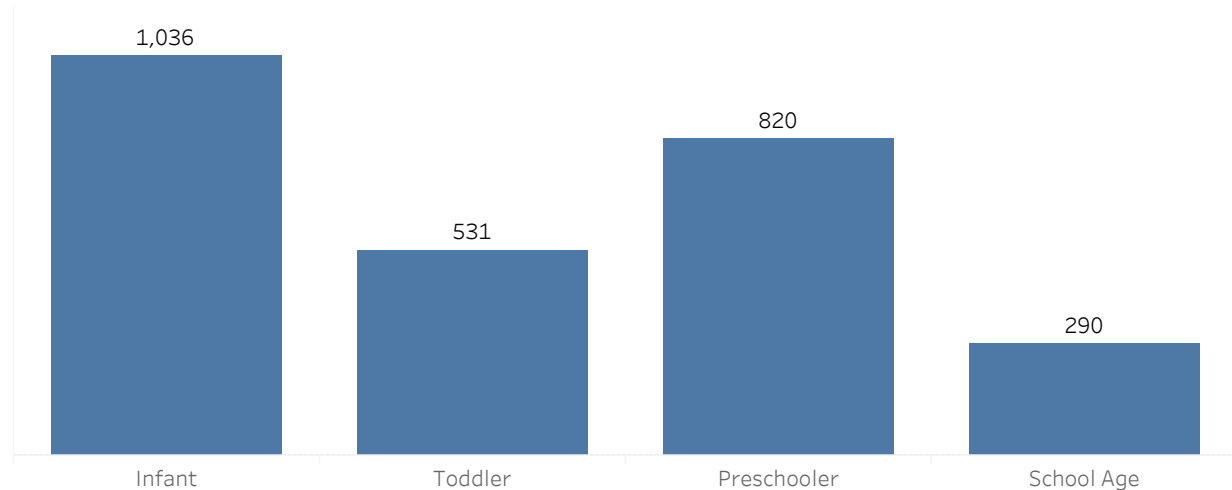

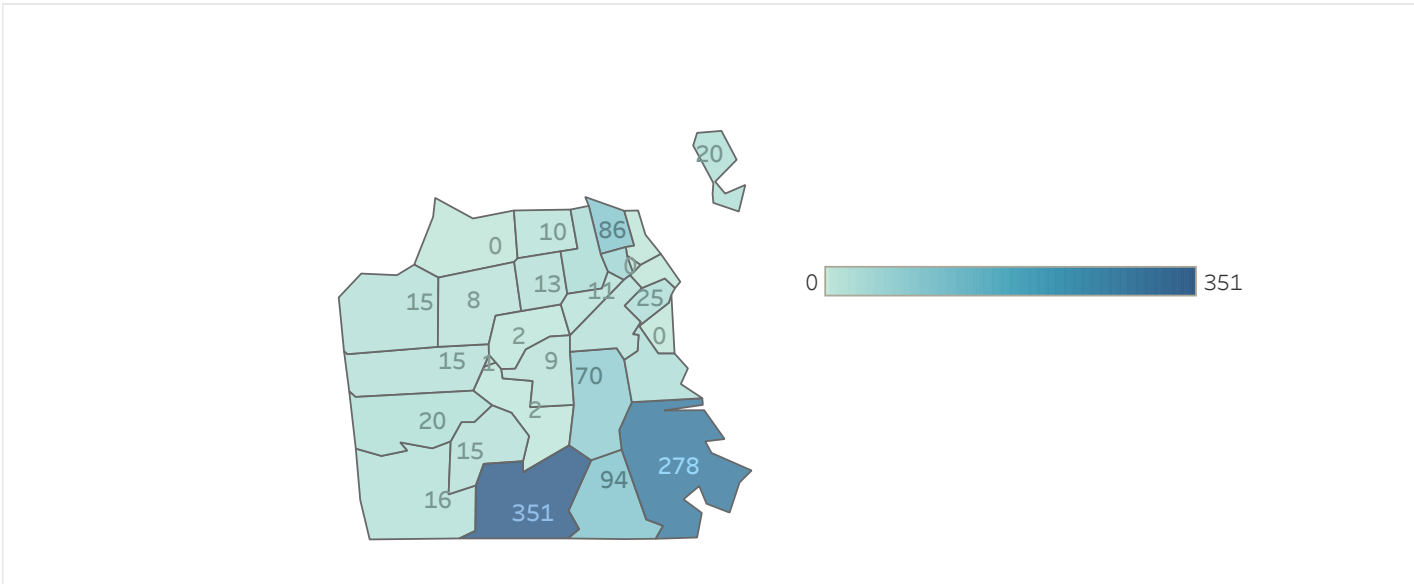


## Open Vacancies in SF Zip Codes: August 2019

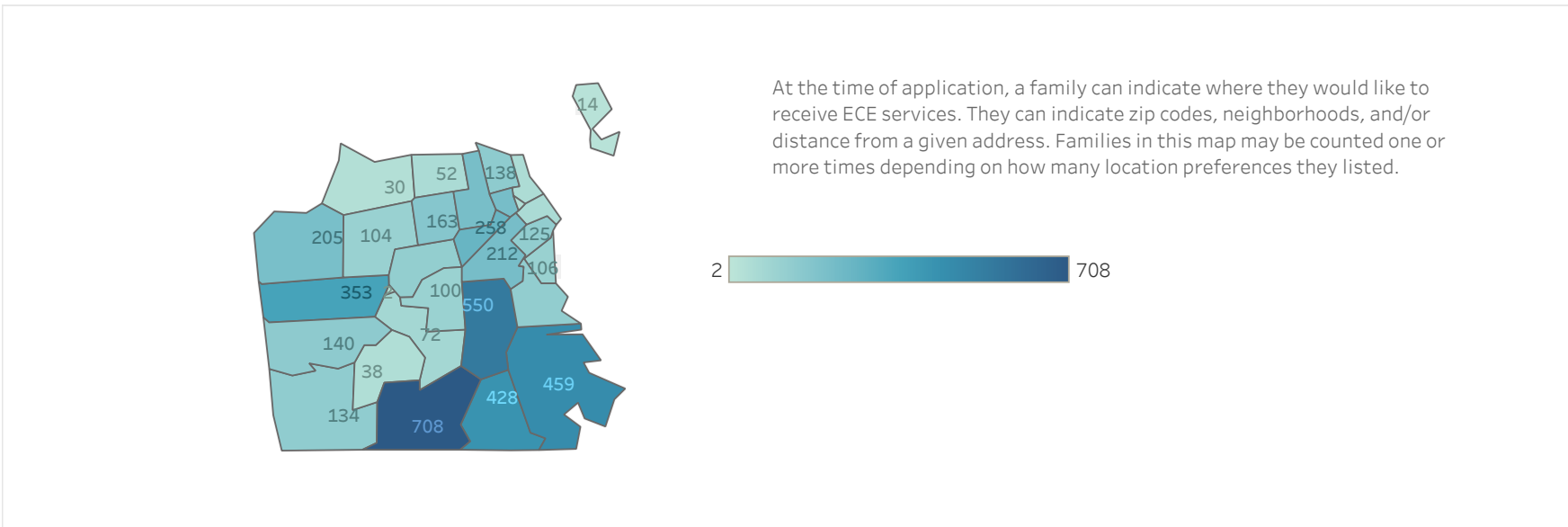

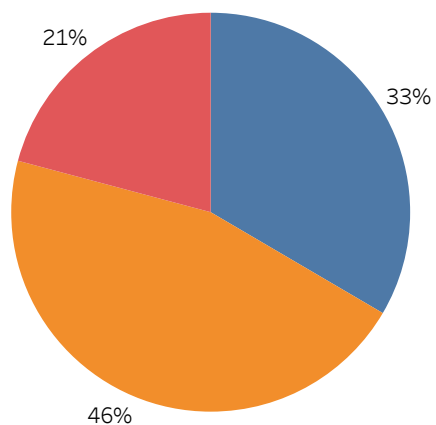
