Para unirse a Aprendizaje temprano para todos(ELFA), su programa debe reunir las siguientes cualificaciones de enseñanza:

Cualificaciones mínimas: propietarios de cuidado infantil familiar

12 unidades de educación de la primera infancia, que incluyan lo siguiente:

- Crecimiento y desarrollo infantil (tres unidades)
- Programa de introducción a la primera infancia (tres unidades)
- Niños, familias y comunidad (tres unidades)
- Educación de la primera infancia optativa para el educador que brinda enseñanza y supervisión a niños (tres unidades)

Cualificaciones mínimas: director del centro/supervisor del sitio

Opción 1:

Una tecnicatura que incluya 24 unidades de educación de la primera infancia con cursos básicos:

- Crecimiento y desarrollo infantil (tres unidades)
- Programa de introducción a la primera infancia (tres unidades)
- Niños, familias y comunidad (tres unidades)
- Educación de la primera infancia optativa para el educador que brinda enseñanza y supervisión a niños (tres unidades)

más gestión/administración de educación de la primera infancia (seis unidades)

más supervisión de educación de la primera infancia (dos unidades)

Opción 2:

Un permiso activo de supervisor del sitio de la Comisión de Acreditación de Maestros (Commission on Teacher Credentialing, CTC) de California

Cualificaciones mínimas: docentes líderes del centro

Opción 1:

24 unidades de educación de la primera infancia, con cursos básicos:

- Crecimiento y desarrollo infantil (tres unidades)
- Programa de introducción a la primera infancia (tres unidades)
- Niños, familias y comunidad (tres unidades)

Un permiso para maestros de la CTC de California activo

A partir del año fiscal 2026-2027, todas las unidades académicas deben provenir de una institución aprobada de acreditación de maestros de California acreditada a nivel regional.



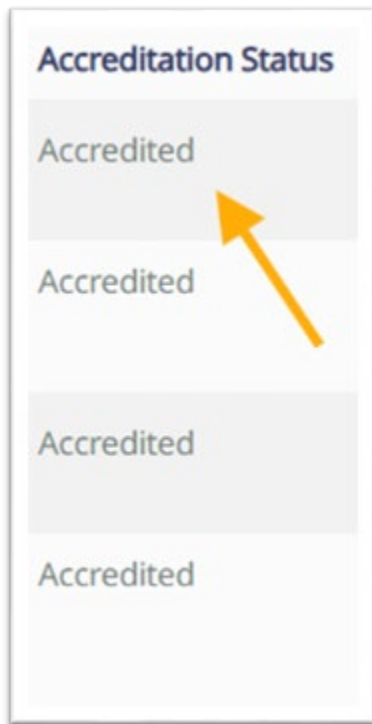

What Does Regional Accreditation Mean?

Home > Credentialing Information > What Does Regional Accreditation Mean?

The Commission can only accept course work and degrees completed at regionally accredited institutions. Degrees and course work must have been completed while the institution was regionally accredited in order for the Commission to consider them for credentialing purposes. Course work completed in other states is acceptable as long as the institution holds regional accreditation through one of the accrediting bodies listed below. Course work and degrees completed outside of the United States must be evaluated by a **Commission-approved foreign transcript evaluation agency** before it may be used for credentialing purposes.

Foreign Transcript Evaluating Agencies

Refer to the [Commission Approved Foreign Transcript Evaluating Agencies](#) list for agencies that have been approved by the Commission to provide evaluation of college or university course work completed at an institution in a country other than the United States.

An agency may submit a written request to the Commission to be added to the list of Commission approved foreign transcript evaluating agencies. An evaluating agency must be a current member of either the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES) or the Association of International Credential Evaluators, Inc. (AICE).
