ECERS-R	11. Nap/rest	3.2 Sanitary Provisions for nap/rest.	At least 18" on three sides.
	15. Books and pictures	5.4 Books, language materials, and activities are appropriate for children in group.	Question asked when potentially frightening or scary books observed accessible to children. Q: I see that you have (book name). How do you introduce books with frightening or violent content to children?
	17. Using language to develop reasoning skills	5.1 Staff talk about logical relationships while children play with materials that stimulate reasoning.	Materials that stimulate reasoning can include collections of natural/found materials.
	24. Dramatic play	5.1 Many dramatic play materials accessible, including dress-up clothes.	At least 6 dress up items need to be accessible to get credit at the 5 level. There is no gender-specific designation of clothing.
	28. Promoting acceptance of diversity	General note	Family photographs are given credit under this Item as well as under Item 6.
